
#### PASTORAL PRAYER & THE LORD'S PRAYER

# **REMEMBRANCE OF BAPTISM** (responsive)

adapted from Enfleshed

In a time where there is too much water and not enough water. Tears sting our eyes and our cheeks flare hot with grief

Beloveds in Christ, Through the waters of baptism, We are brought into the family of God. The body of Christ is rich in Divine creativity, a community of people of many genders, races, body types and sizes, abilities and hungers, each a glimpse of God from a different angle.

# God claims each of us with delight. And we claim one another as companions in faith.

In our baptismal vows, we promise to love and support each other, working together to resist evil, injustice, and oppression in all its forms – within us and around us.

# We need each other in this shared work of enfleshing the dreams of God.

Today, we remember that the love we encounter through these waters cannot be undermined by bigotry or hate, by exclusion or injustice.

# We are children of the Holy One, Siblings in the life of God.

And so today, as we remember our baptism, we also remember that through this new life in Christ we are set free: To love wildly.

Let us pray together.

The possibilities of new life emerge. May it be so for us today as we remember our baptisms. May your Spirit be upon this water and all who gather, as we celebrate this Sacred family to which you have called us. Strengthen us in love for one another as we renew our commitment to the pursuit of the Kindom of God, where all your creatures and creations are beloved and free. Amen.
